<u>Criteria for Selection under Service Quota seats for P.G Medical</u> admission-2009.

(a) The service candidates should apply as stipulated in clause VIII of the Prospectus. The controlling officer after verifying the application will prepare the provisional rank list according to the seniority of service candidates and publish it. The rank list and the applications will be forwarded to the Director of Medical Education within 45days from the last date fixed for the receipt of application. The provisional rank list along with objections received, if any, will be considered by the Post Graduate Selection Committee, as laid down in the Kerala Medical Officers' Admission to Postgraduate Courses under Service Quota Act, 2008 for the selection of the candidates. The committee will prepare and publish final Rankl list.

(b) Health Service quota

This includes <u>eight</u> categories of reservation.

- Seniority in Service Quota (SSQ)
- Rural Service Quota (RSQ)
- Difficult rural area quota- (DRAQ)
- Leprosy Service quota (LEPQ)
- Tuberculosis Service quota (TBQ)
- First Referral Unit quota (FRUQ)
- Family welfare quota (FWQ)
- Prison service quota (PRQ)
- (c) The Health Service Quota applicants can apply for different quotas allotted to them. Allotment of seats to these categories is shown in Annexure III and IV. Selection to different categories of seats in Health Service quota will be based on the list provided by the Director of Health Services. The list of difficult rural areas is mentioned in the G.O (P) No: 70/2003/H&FWD Dated 09/04/2003.

(d) Eligibility and for selection

Seniority in Service Quota (SSQ):

Rank will be reckoned according to the seniority assigned to them in the seniority list prepared by Director of Health Services.

❖ Rural Service Quota (RSQ):

Applicants under this category should have a minimum of 5 years services, out of which 3 years service should be in rural areas.

❖ Difficult Rural Area Quota (DRAQ):

"Minimum period of 5 years service out of which two years of effective service in Difficult Rural Areas as in (c) above, is fixed as eligibility to be considered for Difficult Rural Area Quota".

Leprosy Service Quota (LEPQ):

One seat for M.D. Dermatology is reserved for Doctors of Health Services Department having longest period of service in Leprosy Hospital/Leprosy unit. One year of service in a Leprosy hospital will be equivalent to two years of service in a Leprosy unit under the Directorate of Health services. The minimum service required for claiming this seat will be 5 years service in the department out of which either one year service in a Leprosy Hospital or two years of service in a Leprosy unit. The selection will be made on the basis of seniority in service as decided by the Director of Health Services. If there are no candidates under the above category the seat will be added to Difficult Rural Area Quota (DRQ)

❖ Tuberculosis Service quota (TBQ):

One seat each in M.D. TB & RD and Diploma in TB & RD is reserved under this quota. The minimum service required for claiming this seat will be 5 years service in the department out of which either one year service in a Tuberculosis Hospital or two years of service in a Tuberculosis unit. The selection will be made on the basis of seniority in service as decided by the Director of Health Services. If there are no candidates under the above category the seat will be added to Difficult Rural Area Quota (DRQ)

❖ FRU Quota (FRUQ):

One seat in Diploma in Anaesthesia is earmarked as **FRU quota** to be allotted to a doctor who had undergone training in Anaesthesiology under the scheme of First Referral Unit (FRU). The eligibility for this will be decided by the Director of Health Services on the basis of *inter se* seniority. If no eligible candidate is available the seat will be added to the DRQ.

Family Welfare quota(FWQ):

One seat in DGO is reserved for Family Welfare Award Holders. If no eligible candidate is available the seat will be added to the DRQ.

Prison service quota(PRQ):

One seat in D.Ortho is reserved for Prison service quota. If no eligible candidate is available the seat will be added to the DRQ.

(e) Allotment of seats under Service Quota.

- **1.** All the conditions mentioned in the clause XI (A) of the Prospectus are also applicable to service quota candidates.
- **2.** Allocation of college for the various categories of service candidates will be by rotation in the order shown below.

3. 'When there are no eligible candidates to opt for MESQ, in any specialty, the resultant vacancy will be filled up by the eligible candidates in the HSQ, IMSQ and MUQ who shall take it up in the following order.

1. SSQ 2. RSQ 3. DRAQ 4. IMSQ 5. Municipal Service*

4. If seats become unclaimed in a particular Health Service Quota/Insurance Medical Services Quota/Factories & Boilers Quota/Municipal Services Quota, it shall be offered to candidates of the other quotas and will be allotted in the following order.

1. DRAQ 2. RSQ 3. SSQ 4.IMSQ 5.Municipal Service*

[* among the vacant seats the first seat will be allotted to the candidate under the first category, second seat to second category and so on according to the option of the candidates in each category].

- **5.** If there is still any unclaimed seat in Health Service Quota, Insurance Medical Services Quota and Municipal Services Quota, the same shall be filled up by eligible candidate under MES Quota.
- **6.** "If still there are unclaimed seats in any of the service Quota after final allotment, those vacant seats will go to General Merit."
